#### Sír Arthur Evans (1851-1941)

Most holiday-makers visiting Crete will visit Knossos, the fabulous remains of the Palace of the legendary King Minos.

Their tour guide will show them the King's throne and the colourful restored frescoes of bull leaping and dolphins. They will also see the bust of Arthur Evans on a pedestal. He was the discoverer, excavator and later restorer of much of the site. His classical education erroneously linked the site at first with the legend of Theseus and the Minotaur in the labyrinth.

Evans was the first son of John, later Sir John, Evans and Harriet Dickinson who lived in Nash Mills' village. He was actually born at Abbots Hill where there is a commemorative plaque. His early childhood was spent at Nash Mills House.

Tragically his mother dies when he was just seven years old. Educated at Callipers school, Chipperfield then Harrow before going to Brasenose College, Oxford, to study archaeology. Then followed years of living rough with the tribes in the Balkans during which he was a correspondent to The Manchester Guardian.

The regional authorities objected to his reports, imprisoning him as a result. He was eventually released after a great deal of diplomatic activity on condition that he did not return.

Back in England he became curator of the original Ashmolean Museum at Oxford which he had redeveloped in new premises which have recently been remodelled. There is now a major gallery there describing his life and his discovery of Crete's Minoan Civilisation.

A great deal of the finance for Evans' work at Knossos came from his father and John Dickinson's will, all gained through the manufacture of paper at Nash and their other mills. Truly, a remarkable son of Nash Mills.

#### Reuniting lost and stolen property with rightful owners

A new website, Hertsreunited.co.uk, to help reunite members of the public with their lost and stolen property, was launched in January 2015 by the Police and Crime Commissioner for Hertfordshire and Hertfordshire Constabulary.

The website features photos of found and recovered items, as well as a facility for people to report their lost property.

The Police and Crime Commissioner, David Lloyd, said: "I asked for HertsReunited to be created in order to make it possible for people in Hertfordshire to find their lost or stolen property much more easily.

"If someone has had something stolen – or they want to report a lost possession or something they have found – then this website is a one-stop-shop to help reunite them with their property.

"Although crime is low in the county, being the victim of a burglary, robbery or theft – or even just losing a valued possession by mistake – can be a very distressing experience.

The Constabulary takes temporary possession of property which is suspected to have been stolen, but the Force is sometimes unable to locate its true owner. Likewise, often the Force is made aware of property which has been found in Hertfordshire, but the owner is unknown. Users of the website can now record items that they have lost or found and search the website to see if Hertfordshire Constabulary is holding their stolen or lost property.

Items will be advertised on the website by Hertfordshire Constabulary for around 30 days or an appropriate period until the true owner is identified.

The website is controlled and managed through the current Police Property Management System (PMS) used by the Force.

Where found property is reported to police through HertsReunited and the finder stores it for safe keeping, there may be circumstances where that person can claim to keep the item, if the owner does not come forward.

Found property handed into the police station that remains unclaimed is likely to have to be disposed of, but each case will be taken on its own individual merits. For example, police provide a number of old and damaged bicycles to charitable projects for refurbishment.

Some property is disposed through auction and the funds recouped to support crime reduction. Police also recycle property which has no value or is damaged.

Strenuous effort is made by the police to reunite property with the owner. For example, a camera was handed into police with no identification of its owner. Examination of photographs on it revealed a picture of a dog which was expanded and police were able to read the address tag on the dog collar and the owner contacted.

However, some items prove impossible to identify the owners but we know that they could have sentimental, as well as monetary, value. HertsReunited gives us a much better chance to get property back to their rightful owners.

### **Dementia Friendly Nash Mills**

In May 2014, Public Health England and Alzheimer's Society came together to inspire the Dementia Friends campaign, to tackle stigma against dementia by creating a network of one million Dementia Friends by March 2015. You may have seen the advert on TV featuring Gina Shaw, a 61 year old woman from Liverpool with early stage dementia and a series of well-known faces including Chris Martin, Lily Allen, Sir Terry Pratchett, Amanda Holden, Paul O'Grady, Pixie Lott and Alesha Dixon singing the iconic Beatles' song 'With a Little Help from my Friends'.

A Dementia Friend is someone who has gained an understanding of dementia and the small things they can do that can make a difference to people living with the condition. Essentially it is about being calm, kind and patient in situations where a person with dementia might be having difficulty.

Becoming a Dementia Friend does not involve raising money for charity or donating your time on a regular basis. We simply ask that Dementia Friends remember what they have learned and put it into practice when they meet someone who might need their help, whether this is through their work or in their day-to-day life.

Dementia Friends sessions last 45 minutes and are delivered by local Dementia Champions – if you are interested in taking part in a session and joining the 1 million Dementia Friends please contact:
